Session Highlights:

DI factors such as Incentives and Energy were faithfully explored whilst other WORLD FORUM favourites such as Innovation and Workforce were given a fresh twist.

With a nod to Philadelphia's pharma pre-eminence, much of the Innovation panel was based around the life sciences industries but robotics were represented too and India's TATA and Denmark's Novozymes each described the ways in which innovation in their organisations is more of a creed than an activity.

With regard to Workforce, this year's panel did not dwell on the difficulties of recruiting and retaining skilled workers around the world but looked instead at the effects of religion and other cultural baggage on employee relations in multinational organisations. Particularly interesting was the effect of culturally insensitive acquisitions on the morale and productivity of the workforce.

New to Philadelphia's WORLD FORUM were panels on Water, the blue gold of the immediate future, Cyber Security, Reshoring, Real Estate moves towards Inner Cities from the Suburbs and a Consultants' Roundtable which provided a quick round-up of FDI Trends around the Globe.
